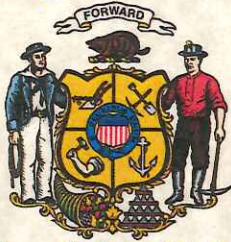

WHEREAS; CMSA is a nonprofit organization proud of the contribution their membership makes to the quality of health care in Wisconsin; and


WHEREAS; Case Managers and those members of the CMSA in the State of Wisconsin provide dedicated and compassionate care in an increasingly intense and demanding environment;
